

Statute of Limitations

For breaches of Contract: 6 years from the date on which the cause of action accrues (s14(1)(a) of *Limitation Act 1969*) and 12 years if cause of action founded on a deed (s16 of *Limitation Act 1969*).

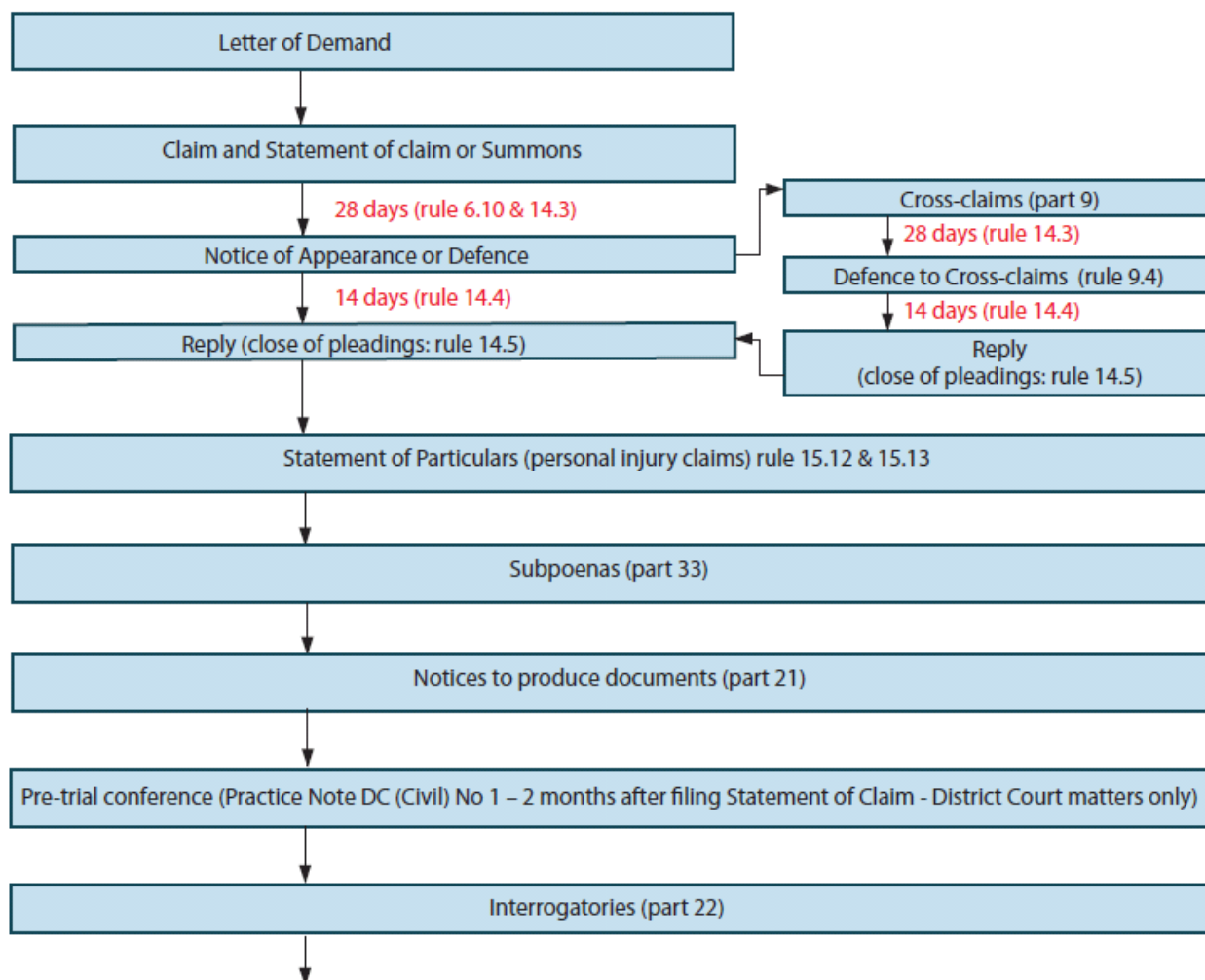
For Tort: 6 years (s14(1)(b) of *Limitation Act 1969*).

For Personal Injury (common law claim): 3 years from the date when the cause of action is discoverable or 12 years from the time when the act or omission causing injury or death occurred (s50C(1)(a) & (b)) *Limitation Act 1969*.

(*Note - for personal injury limitation periods prior to 6/12/02 refer to s18A and s14 of *Limitation Act 1969*).

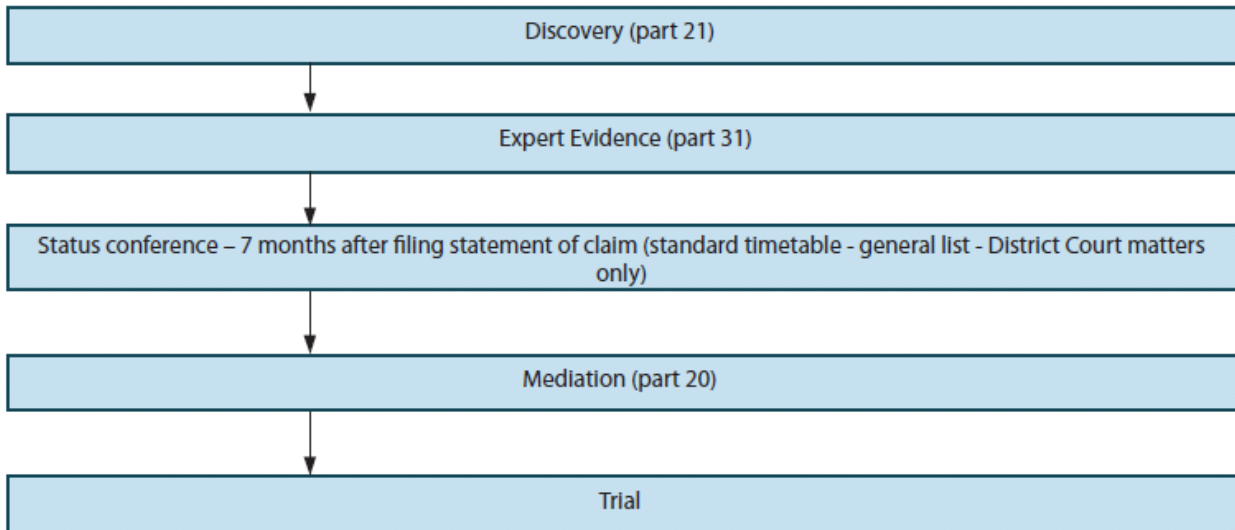
