

Statute of Limitations

For Breaches of Contract: 6 years (s 11(1) of *Limitation Act 1985*)

For tort: 6 years (s 11(1) of *Limitation Act 1985*)

For personal injuries tort: 3 years (ss 16A and 16B *Limitation Act 1985*)

For a 'wrongful act or omission causing death' under Part 3.1 *Civil Law Wrongs Act 2002*: 6 years from date of wrongful act (s 16(a) *Limitation Act 1985*) or 3 years from death (s 16(b) *Limitation Act 1985*)

Contribution between tortfeasors under *Civil Law (Wrongs) Act 2002*: expires when the first of following ends – 2 years from date when contribution first accrues or 4 years from end of limitation period for first cause of action (ss 21(1)(a) and (b) *Limitation Act 1985*)

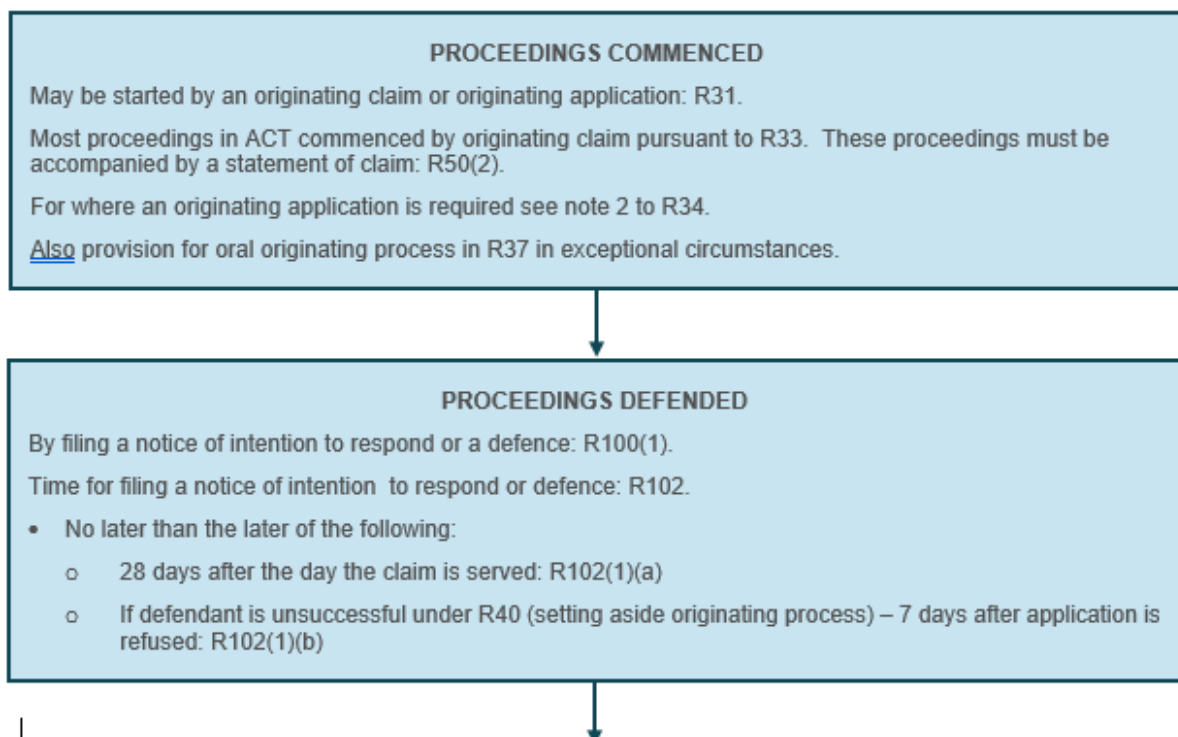
Court Monetary Jurisdiction

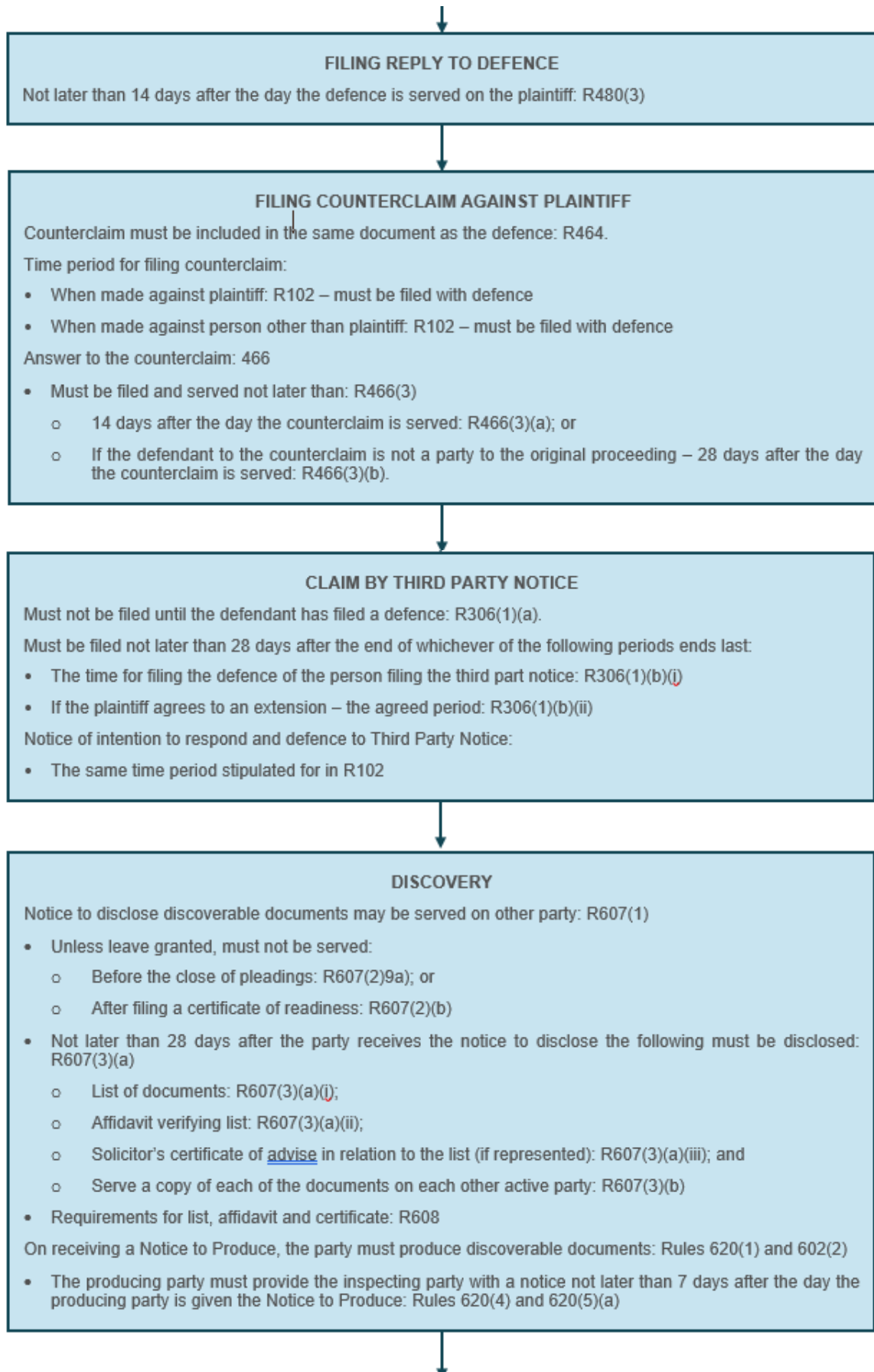
Civil and Administrative Tribunal: disputes below \$25,000

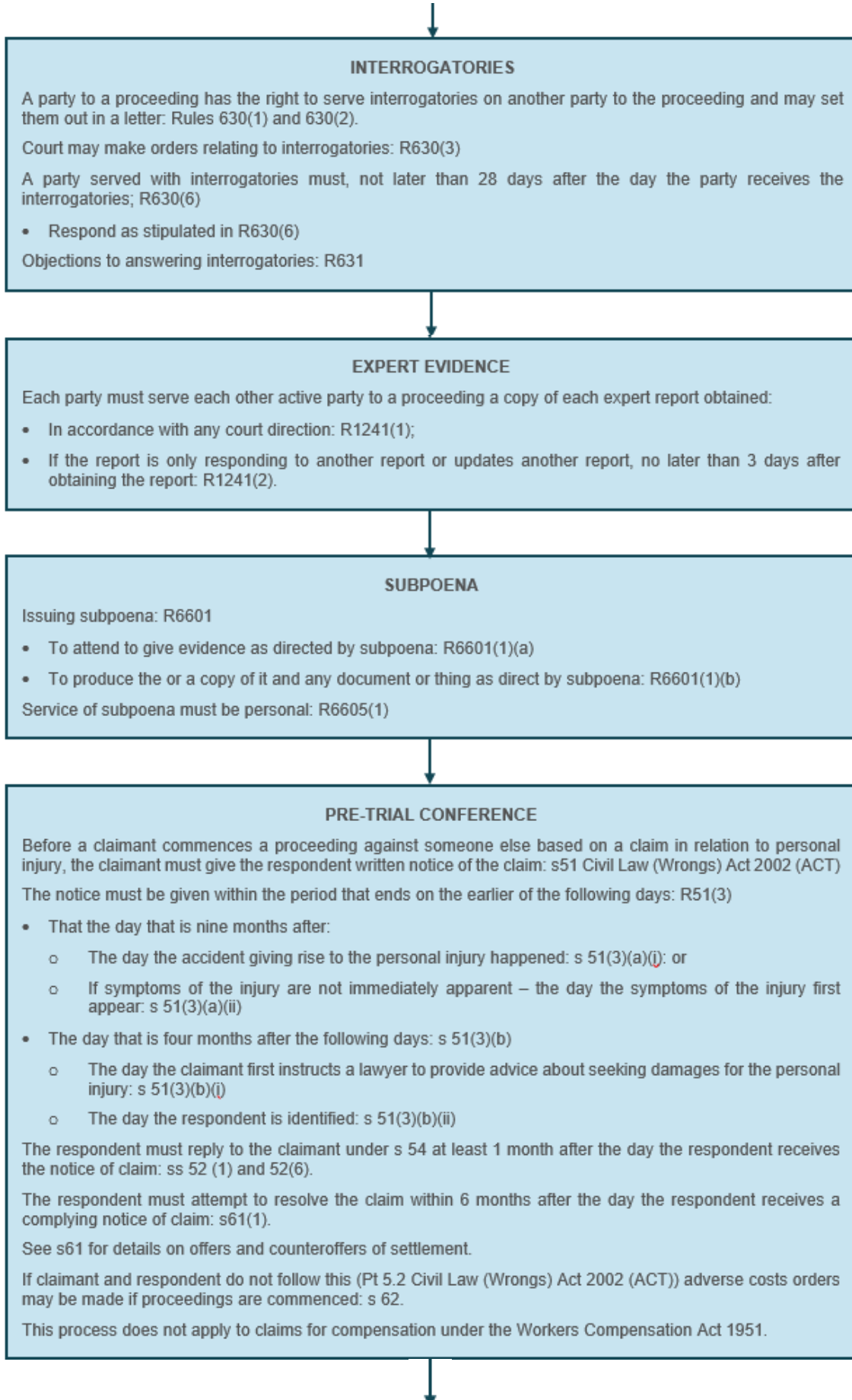
Magistrates Court: disputes \$25,000 and \$250,000 (except cases concerning land title)

Supreme Court: matters in excess of \$250,000 and/or concerning land title to land

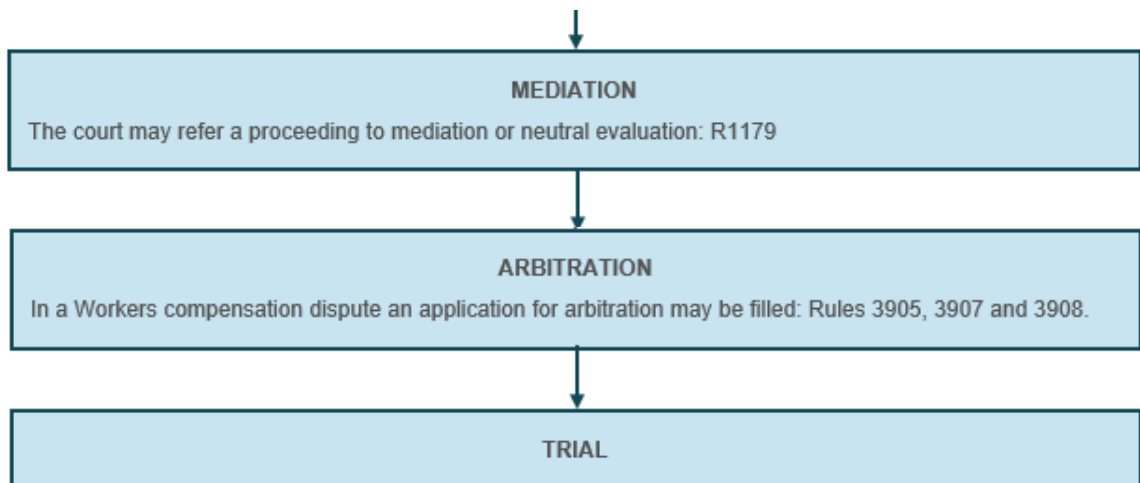
